# Advantages of Arrest

- **Paul (finally) has an opportunity to rest.**
  - Acts 21-28 covers 4 years.
  - 24:27; 28:30, 31
- **After three preaching trips, his body would have sorely needed some relaxation.**
- **2 Corinthians 11:21-33**

# Advantages of Arrest

- **Paul had an opportunity to be productive.**
  - **Yes, even while resting he was busy.**
- 1. Preach.**
  - **Acts 28:30, 31**
  - **Philippians 4:22**
- 2. Write letters.**
  - **Prison epistles were written during this time.**

# Advantages of Arrest

- **Acts was written**
  - **28:30, 31**
  - **Luke 1:1-4; Acts 1:1, 2**

# Advantages of Arrest

- **Paul fulfilled his mission**
  - **Acts 9:15, 16**
  - **Acts 24:24, 25**

# Advantages of Arrest

- Paul influenced many he would never have met.
  - Acts 27:43
  - Acts 28:7-10
